Sister Stacey has been a member of GTI for 21 years. Prior to joining, she was residing in Texas. She met her husband, Elder James Tucker at a wedding both were attending in Texas. They started dating, got engaged, got married in Texas, and he moved her to California. He was already a member of GTI but she wasn't sure this was the church she wanted to join. But he told her the family that prays together, stays together, so she said that she would pray about it. She said, "One Sunday, the Spirit was high, the doors of the church were opened, and I just joined. I didn't even discuss it with my husband before making that decision but it has been the best decision of my life."

Sister Stacey first began working with the Children's Ministry because her daughter was a part of this ministry, then the young ministry people providing academic assistance. She took a break from tutoring when the pandemic hit. She continues to provide these services as her private business. She would love to do it again in person for GTI. The benefits of in person tutoring are greater than on Zoom. Initially, she joined the Women's Chorus. Everyone was asking, "Don't you want to come on over and sing in the regular choir?" But my daughter was young and I didn't want to make that kind of commitment. In Texas, she was always a part of the Music Ministry. Her mom was the Minister of Music at the church. So, she joined the choir for a while but took a break. When her mom passed away, she was dealing with the loss and had to go to Texas to take care of her mom's final arrangements. When that was done and she returned home, she found herself just sitting in the choir rehearsals for strength and encouragement. The choir members started telling her, "You are here every week, you should come back to singing." But she was at the rehearsals for another reason. Finally, she came back and then they asked her to join the Praise and Worship team. She's been singing and using her gift for over 18 years.

In 2017, Elder Tucker started having health challenges that have progressively gotten worse through the years. It has been very difficult for Sister Stacey to provide 24 hour care for Elder Tucker with all of his medical needs, working full time to maintain the household obligations,

and still keep her commitment to God, the Praise and Worship team, and the choir. She said, "It's been God's strength and the prayers of the righteous that has been keeping me." When she feels like she can't do it any longer, it's the text messages saying, "You got this, you can make it, God's got you." This is my assignment right now and I believe God for his healing.

Call Out Jezebel

In Hebrew, Jezebel's name means garbage. This infamous Women of the Bible takes 1st place for a life filled of sin and shame that displeased the LORD. Jezebel was a Phoenician princess, daughter of the King of the Sidonian, and wife of Ahab, Israel's most wicked King.

Jezebel was known for her seduction and ruthless evil deeds. She worshipped Baal and hated everything associated with the only true God and the servants of God. She ordered the execution of all the prophets of the Lord (1 Kings 18:4,13) and replaced God's altars with those of Baal. She was a murderess who arranged the death of Naboth to take away his land to give to her husband for his vineyard. Her acts of evil cause even Elijah to flee when he heard about her plan.

Jezebel authorized herself to be called a prophetess. Her character was marked with extreme violence, hunger for power, deception, and manipulation. Her most grievous sin to God was her sexual immorality and idol worship that opposed the truth of God. Her actions and unrepentant sin caused her death and destruction. (1 Kings 21:23)

The wicked spirit that empowered Jezebel exists today in effort to destroy God's plan for worship, service, and holy living. Woman of God, be quick to check and recheck your spirit. "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you". (James 4:7) Listen to the Spirit of God, and hear him. Repent of wrong sinful deeds as God gives you the time to do so. Be watchful of the subtle defiant evil that influence and seek to distract your worship and commitment to God.

Jezebel's story shows that evil may prosper temporarily but will eventually be punished and justice will prevail. Evil must be repented of when God gives the time and space to do so. Call out Jezebel, do not wait. (Rev 2:20-22)
